This Fall semester celebrated return to more normalcy on campus and in our Fraternity & Sorority Community. We saw some traditional events and programs come back, and the buzz on campus was exciting. Homecoming came back as a large and in-person occurrence. Our formal recruitment processes happened, once again. It was good to see people face-to-face!

With that return to a more "normal" feel, we encountered some membership challenges. Across campus, we have found that students have been willing to attend events and activities, but they've been less willing to engage as members of the groups that make these things happen. Since the beginning of the pandemic, recruitment of new members has been a bit of a challenge, and we've seen a bit of a decline in both membership and recruitment, with both being down about 30%. Those who are here are stepping up as leaders, though, and doing a good job to create and provide a great experience. We are working hard to adjust to changes in Minnesota State Mankato's new student orientation programs, affecting our community-wide marketing, but we're also working to impress upon chapters the necessity of using the resources they're provided and doing work over the summer months to reach out to prospective members. For some chapters, fraternities in particular, the idea of having to recruit

members over the summer is new. The reality is that they will need to adjust and make this a priority.

Fraternities and Sororities, along with our governing councils, elect officers on a calendar-year basis. This means that we're in the midst of election season. In this newsletter, you'll find the list of known council and chapter leaders. We'll install them and recognize our outgoing officers in a ceremony on December 5.

For the last edition of our alumni newsletter, we gave our students the chance to tell their current story. The feedback from that was great, so we're doing it again!
