ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Occupational Therapy Preparation emphasis in Applied Health Science is for students seeking to pursue a graduate degree in Occupational Therapy. Admission requirements for graduate degrees in Occupational Therapy differ by program. Additional courses may be required.

Pre-Occupational Therapy is a pre-professional advising track, not a degree program that focuses on pre-requisite courses for graduate programs. An undergraduate degree is required along with the Pre-Occupational Therapy track.
