We offer a BS in Recreation, Parks and Leisure Services with an emphasis in Leisure Behavior, Leisure Planning and Management, Therapeutic Recreation, and Resource Management.

WHAT CAREER OPPORTUNITIES ARE AVAILABLE FOR STUDENTS COMPLETING THESE PROGRAMS?

Career Opportunities

A wide range of positions and settings are available including:

- Municipal and non-profit recreation; camps; resorts; amusement areas; military recreation; special events management;
- Hospitals; rehabilitation centers; correctional facilities; behavioral health centers; adaptive sport and recreation agencies; psychiatric units;
- Park rangers at state, national, and county parks; naturalist; interpreter; park planners.

Academic Opportunities

Students are prepared for:

- Graduate programs in Recreation, Parks and Leisure Services and other related fields.
- National certification exams such as the Certified Therapeutic Recreation Specialist and Certified Parks and Recreation Professional exams.

EXAMINING THE QUALITY OF OUR PROGRAM

The program is one of 80 national programs accredited by the Council on Accreditations of National Parks, Recreation and Tourism and Related Professions (COAPRT). This is the <u>only</u> COAPRT accredited program in the state.

Faculty

All six faculty have Ph.D.s and experience working in the field. Faculty advise students in coursework and practicum experience. No classes are taught by teaching assistants.

OTHER SPECIAL PROGRAMS:

Program components

A 560-hour, 14-week practicum is required for this program. Many courses offering experiential learning that extends the classroom into the community. Students are provided with funding support to attend and connect with professionals at the Minnesota Recreation and Park Association, Minnesota Therapeutic Recreation Association State Conference and other national conferences in the RPLS field.

Scholarships

State, regional, national, and departmental achievement awards are available each academic year.

Clubs and organizations

The Recreation, Parks, and Leisure Service Club holds meetings and networking opportunities twice each month during the academic year.

HOW DOES A STUDENT PREPARE FOR THIS PROGRAM?

General high school preparation is adequate. Volunteer or part-time experience in recreation and parks organizations or agencies in advantageous.

Students must complete RPLS 272

(Introduction to Recreation, Parks and Leisure Services) with a "C" or better before admission to the program. Students are expected to maintain a minimum of 2.0 GPA and complete RPLS classes with a "C" or better.
