Teaching k-6 Licensure with program endorsements in Middle School communication arts and literature.

A major component of professional education coursework involves clinical experiences in area schools. These field experiences are developmentally sequenced opportunities to apply learning to the field of practice, culminating in a year-long student teaching experience. Such structured and sequenced experiences expose students to the full range of responsibilities of today's educators, while furthering learning and skill development, and nurturing dispositions.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Elementary school teaching requires a wide variety of skills and aptitudes, including a talent for working with children; organizational, administrative, and record keeping abilities; research, and communication skills; the power to influence, motivate, and train others; patience, and creativity. Other occupations requiring some of these aptitudes include college and university faculty, counselors, education administrators, media generalists, preschool teachers, public relations specialists, sales representatives, social workers, and trainers and employee development specialists.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the average salary for public elementary school teachers is \$55,290. Private school teachers and early childhood education teachers, generally earn less than public school teachers.

Teachers earning a masters in conjunction with classroom experience, are generally eligible for additional economic compensation.
